

12th WORLD FERTILIZER CONGRESS

Memorandum of the first planning meeting, July 25-28, 1998
at IAE-CAS, Shenyang, P.R. China, with adoption by CIEC

A. The meeting concluded:

1. There is enough evidence that the scientists from CAS are capable to organize the 12th World Fertilizer Congress (WFC) jointly with The International Scientific Centre of Fertilizers (CIEC) in 2001 (Annex 1).
2. The suggested title of the congress is: "**FERTILIZATION IN THE THIRD MILLENIUM** - *Fertilizers, Food Security and Applied Ecology* -

The rationale for the suggested title is: the 12th WFC of CIEC is the first World Congress on fertilizers in the new millennium and it shall focus on challenges of fertilization for the future of mankind. In this context **FERTILIZATION** has to meet the requirements of **FOOD SECURITY**, both in quantity and quality and has to be performed as a measure of **APPLIED ECOLOGY** in order to protect natural resources for sustainable agricultural development.

After some discussions with different Chinese agricultural organizations it might be more explanatory, if a third subtitle of the title would carry a phrase like: - *meeting the demands of economy and ecology* -

3. The congress will be jointly organized involving CIEC, CAS (ISSAS, IAE, IB), MOA, NFNS, SETC, FAL-PB. Other cooperation partners may arise from the discussion with officials of the Chinese government (i.a. Annex II).
4. The venue shall be in Beijing. On July 31, 1998 the meeting investigated several venues and found the Beijing International Convention Center in connection with the Beijing Continental Grand Hotel a suitable place for the congress. The manager of the venue, Mr. Peng Peng, will alert the organizing committee if other events should clash with the time in focus, but negotiations with the venue management will take place earliest in the beginning of 2000.
5. The congress shall be held from August 3-9 in 2001.
6. The congress shall be a four days with eight invited keynote lectures delivered by internationally acknowledged scientists. The committee expects about 500 scientific contributions. These contributions will be organized in individual workshops, preferably as “oral contributions with poster assistance”. The committee expects about 600-800 participants in total.
7. There shall be scientific and tourist pre- and post-congress tours.
8. The keynote presentations shall be published as peer-reviewed papers together with elaborated scientific summary reports of each workshop in a book (eventually one of a series) entitled “Fertilization, Food Security and Applied Ecology”. Voluntary scientific contributions will be published as short communications in the congress proceedings published by CIEC jointly with CAS.

9. There shall be a

- Honorary committee consisting of official from politics, science and economy
- Organizing committee consisting of those persons actively involved in the realization of the congress
- Scientific committee consisting of scientists serving before, during and after the congress as advisors, referees and moderators

10. The president of the congress shall be nominated by the Chinese officials. It would be highly appreciated if the congress would be opened by **H. E. the President of the P. R. of China** or another high representative of the Chinese government

11. Subject to acceptance by CAS and SKW, Prof. Zhenping Wang is suggested as the Secretary General (SG) of the congress

12. CAS shall immediately nominate at least two junior scientists responsible for work to be done before the congress (building up an electronic and conventional mailing list, assisting the organizing committee and the secretary general in all matters related to the congress). FAL-PB will assist the Chinese colleagues in installing a "WFC Task Force Group". Tentative names are listed in Annex II.

13. The members of the meeting shall immediately start to investigate possibilities for funding to enable the Chinese scientists nominated in "12" to conduct a scientific training of 3 months each at FAL-PB

14. The organizing committee shall start immediately to raise necessary funding to realize the congress.

B. The meeting agreed on

- a tentative schedule for the pre-congress time (Annex III)
- a tentative budget for the congress (Annex IV)

C. The meeting makes the following offers towards the engagement of CIEC in the 12th WFC:

- The president of CIEC will be invited on costs of the congress to deliver a general scientific lecture during the opening ceremony of the congress. The title of this lecture shall be in agreement with the organization committee and shall be included in the books “ Fertilizers, Food Security and Applied Ecology”.
- The Deputy President of CIEC will be invited on costs of the congress to deliver one of the key note lectures.
- CIEC receives a royalty fee of 20\$ from each paying participant. Modes of transfer of the money will be agreed between CIEC and the organizing committee after inauguration of the organizing committee.
- Members of CIEC, who have paid their membership fees for 2001 will be granted a reduction of 30\$ off the congress fee.
- All costs of publishing will be covered by the congress budget, but CIEC will still be the nominal publisher and the standards for CIEC’s publications will be respected.
- From the sum which is left after all variable costs of the congress are deduced from the congress fees paid, CIEC will be asked to assist to contribute to the editing of the congress proceedings.

At an assumed inflation rate of 8% p.a. in 2001 the costs may be ¼ higher than today's level!

ANNEX V (continued)

Assuming that sending one scientist from China attending a conference abroad costs approximately 2000 USD and assuming 300USD for participation of the WFC in Beijing, the whole congress would break even for the Chinese, if only 85 (!!) Chinese scientists would join the congress.

With other words, expecting 300 Chinese scientists participating, the theoretical value of the congress for the Chinese amounts to 600,000 USD,

which is 4 times more than the total congress costs!
